The Olympics were first written about in 776 B.C. when the games were held at the sacred site of OLYMPIA, IN GREECE

In ancient Greece, Olympic athletes COVERED THEIR BODIES IN OLIVE OIL AND FINE SAND, in part to protect their skin from the sun.

CHEATERS in early Olympic Games had to PAY A FINE that was used to erect a statue of Zeus, called a Zane, with the cheater's name inscribed on the base.
